Approval of Minutes via email. There are 15 voting members of the community council, 13 approved the minutes of January 24, 2023 and 2 offered no response.



Topics to discuss/review:

- 1. **JPJ Celebrations:** WIDA completion, Panthers in State STEM Fair.
 - a. Joel P. Jensen Middle School has the highest Multilanguage (ML) learners. WIDA testing went well. There is only one student that still needs testing.
 - b. Three students have been chosen to go on to the State STEM Fair that will be held in April. The students are Abigale VanDusen, Elise Braegger, and Nathan Carsen.
 - c. Courtney Beesley was chosen by the Jordan Education Foundation as Joel P. Jensen Middle School's Teacher of the Year.

2. JPJ News/Notes

- a. **Update on Honors Math.** There will be no change to Honors Math next year.
- b. Ideas on how to boost numbers. Discussed ideas to build a positive image of Joel P. Jensen Middle School and boost enrollment. Some ideas included participating the West Jordan 4th of July Parade, articles in the West Jordan Journal, posters and signs of school events in stores, spotlight school clubs, etc. Aaron mentioned that his goal is to make Joel P. Jensen a community center to offer services to everyone (i.e., English Language classes, classes on how to do taxes, how to get driver's licenses, etc.). He is planning on making after school programs more robust next year.
- c. **Open Positions @JPJ**. The school currently needs a Multilanguage (ML) Aide and Resource (Special Ed) Aide. They have open positions for Language Arts and Physical Education for next year.
- d. Literacy night! Barbie Curtis explained that Literacy Night will be held on Tuesday, March 14th starting at 6:00 p.m. There will be an Eagle Rescue program with focus on resiliency, vote for PTSA Board for next year, hot dog dinner, literacy activities, book fair, pickleball court in gym, free books, Principal's Pantry open, photo with the eagle, and visit from the Mayor.
- 3. **Counselor's Report.** The Multilanguage Learner (ML) data is looking positive. There is a Multicultural Night being held on March 23rd from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. There will be food and performances. Handout was given.
- 4. **2022-23 Land Trust approval/comments.** Handout given of the 2022-23 Land Trust Plan and current progress. Discussion was held about the different goals. Question was raised about IXL Math not being part of the budget this year. Cindy Horrocks mentioned it will not be used in the same way next year. Discussion was held on ways to help students improve math skills. Aaron Hunter mentioned that his focus is on individual student learning and growth. Russell Stephenson explained the importance of helping teachers understand their content, keep



current and work with PLC's (Professional Learning Communities). Barbie Curtis mentioned she will look into headphones that will help translate for EL Students.
