**JPJMS School Community Council Meeting Minutes** 

**Those in attendance:** Jimmy Anderson, Shanna Anderson (Chair), Andrea Banks, Kira Hansen, Nicole Simister, Tiffany Southworth (Vice Chair), Barbara Young, Jody Deland, Abby Hart, Bryan Leggat, Patrice Shaffer, Joshua Stott, and Derek Winder.

Called to order at 4:31 p.m. by Shanna Anderson via Zoom.

- 1. Welcome by Shanna Anderson
- 2. **Minutes from Previous Meeting (November 10) approved via email**. There are 19 members of the community council; 16 approved the minutes and 3 offered no response.
- 3. **Celebrations and Latest News**. Bryan Leggat welcomed Jody Deland back after her Covid-19 health challenge. He also celebrated the school's radio version of "It's a Wonderful Life" and all the work of Ms. Hanks and many others. He celebrated not having as many students on quarantine and mentioned being "punked" by the teachers. Jody Deland celebrated the students and their efforts to wear their masks. She noted that student behavior is very good.
- 4. **Counseling: Course Selection Update.** Derek Winder reported that the Counseling Center successfully completed their formal site review with the state in mid-December. The counselors are doing the 8<sup>th</sup> grade PCCR meetings via Zoom. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade parent meeting will be via Zoom on January 28<sup>th</sup>. The 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade course selection will take place in the math classes on

February 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, but may change. The high school usually does course selection through the 9<sup>th</sup> grade geography classes, but we don't know a date yet.

## 5. Principal's Report:

- a. **Covid Update** given by Joshua Stott. Mr. Stott reviewed the latest Covid guidelines. He mentioned that with mask-to-mask exposure and the new guidelines there will be a big difference in how many students have to be quarantined.
- b. **Technology Update** given by Bryan Leggat. We have received 300 touchscreen chromebooks for the 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Parents were given the option to have the students receive the new chromebooks or keep the older one they've been using. They have distributed 160 of the 300 chromebooks.
- 6. **SNAP-Plan Review and Approval** given by Joshua Stott. Mr. Stott explained that the SNAP plan shows the safest way to get to the school within the school boundaries. He asked for input on areas that are dangerous and need attention that he can take to the city council. Several things were mentioned. Bryan will talk to the students about crossing the street by the school using the crossing guards instead of using the self-crossing by the post office; and the dangers of pretending to shove students into the street. Jimmy Anderson mentioned that a Big O and Maverick are going to be built on 7800 S. 3200 W. This will make this intersection busier and might want to look at lights. If you think of other hazards, contact Joshua Stott before January 22<sup>nd</sup>. Mr. Stott will get with Shanna Anderson to sign the plan when it is finalized.
- 7. **Report: Current School Trustlands plan status and progress.** Bryan Leggat reviewed the current Trustlands plan. He mentioned that the summer math and reading camps did not take place because of Covid, and that Ascend Math was not being used. He said that the reading and math camps can be held in June. The council was in favor of holding the camps in June using the current budget.
- 8. **Discussion: Ideas for next School Trustlands plan.** Bryan Leggat mentioned that the West Jordan Feeder Grant (to reduce class size) ends so will be unable to replace the \$195,000. He expressed gratitude for the grant. Mr. Leggat reviewed ideas for the next School Trustlands plan including reading and math camp, math aides, Reading Plus licenses, academic coaches, teacher professional development, substitutes for professional development, and technology. He said he will send the information to Shanna Anderson to have her send to the council for review before the next meeting. Moby Max was mentioned to help with reading and math. Bryan mentioned they are looking at it through the SpEd classes.
- 9. **Calendar.** Joshua Stott sent out a calendar of upcoming events for January, February and March. He mentioned that he doesn't have information about school concerts. Feedback was given that the virtual concerts went great. It was also mentioned that Ms. Hanks is looking at doing a school musical.
- 10. **Opportunity for Community Comments.** It was mentioned that it is nice to have students back in school. Bryan Leggat mentioned that some have felt that this year's Friday interventions have not gone as well as having RTI during the week. Bryan asked the council to talk to their neighbors and get their feelings about RTI on Friday versus daily during the week.
